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Scriptures, Questions, & Assignment

1. What did you learn from your study of Ezekiel 36 this past week?
2. Why have we become so lukewarm? What can be done about it?

Daniel 8:14 (NKJV): *“For two thousand three hundred days; then the sanctuary shall be cleansed.”*
([Daniel 8:14](#), NKJV)

Daniel 8:25-26 (CSB): *He will cause deceit to prosper through his cunning and by his influence, and in his own mind he will exalt himself. He will destroy many in a time of peace; he will even stand against the Prince of princes. Yet he will be broken – not by human hands. The vision of the evenings and the mornings that has been told is true.* ([Daniel 8:25-26](#), CSB)

Daniel 9:24 (NKJV): *“Seventy weeks are determined for your people and for your holy city ...”*
([Daniel 9:24](#), NKJV)

Daniel 9:25 (NKJV): *“Know therefore and understand, that from the going forth of the command to restore and build Jerusalem until Messiah the Prince, there shall be seven weeks and sixty-two weeks ...”* ([Daniel 9:25](#), NKJV)

Daniel 9:27 (NKJV): *“Then he shall confirm a covenant with many for one week; but in the middle of the week He shall bring an end to sacrifice and offering ...”* ([Daniel 9:27](#), NKJV)

Daniel 8:14 (NKJV): "... then the sanctuary shall be cleansed." (**Daniel 8:14**, NKJV)

Hebrews 8:5 (NIV): *They serve at a sanctuary that is a copy and shadow of what is in heaven. This is why Moses was warned when he was about to build the tabernacle: "See to it that you make everything according to the pattern shown you on the mountain."*
(**Hebrews 8:5**, NIV – quoting **Exodus 25:40**)

Hebrews 9:24 (NLT): *For Christ did not enter into a holy place made with human hands, which was only a copy of the true one in heaven. He entered into heaven itself to appear now before God on our behalf.* (**Hebrews 9:24**, NLT)

Jeremiah 31:33-34 (NIV): *"This is the covenant I will make with the people of Israel after that time," declares the LORD. "I will put my law in their minds and write it on their hearts. I will be their God, and they will be my people ... For I will forgive their wickedness and will remember their sins no more."* (**Jeremiah 31:33-34**, NIV)
